Parkview Physicians Group: Six physicians formed a primary care department of Parkview Hospital in 1995; in 1997, 43 affiliated physicians established Parkview Medical Group (PMG). In 2009, PMG became Parkview Physicians Group (PPG) with the acquisition of primary care physicians; specialists in cardiovascular and colorectal surgery; and OB/GYN. Now, PPG includes nearly 1,100 providers in more than 40 specialties in nearly 300 locations throughout northeast Indiana and northwest Ohio.

Parkview Research Center: A research function participating in national and international medical research that brings the newest technology and medical breakthroughs to the Fort Wayne area.

Parkview Employer Solutions: A combination of four service lines aimed at improving the financial health of area companies and the physical and mental health of their employees. Includes the Signature Care PPO network, Occupational Health, Employee Assistance Program and Workplace Wellness.
