- Parkview Trauma Centers treat all trauma patients regardless of age.
- Parkview has special research interests in:
 - · Hip fracture pain management

- The Trauma team actively presents/publishes scientific analysis of trauma care at national conferences and in national journals.
- The Trauma team provides annual adult, geriatric and pediatric trauma symposia, as well as training opportunities throughout the year enabling pre-hospital and hospitalbased providers to maintain/build trauma care knowledge and skills. Other outreach and education provided includes the Rural Trauma Team Development Course (RTTDC), Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS), trauma simulation and mass casualty simulation.

Statistics (Based on November 2021 YTD data)

Total number of admitted trauma patients: 2,450

Parkview Samaritan transported about 32% of major trauma patients.

55% of trauma patients were transported directly to the trauma center from the scene of the injury.

68% of admitted major trauma patients were male, with an average age of 41.

Car-related injuries/crashes were the number one cause of major trauma admits (31%).

Only 3.7% of admitted trauma patients had penetrating injuries (such as gunshot wounds).

History:

- Trauma Services was developed at Parkview Hospital in 1989 with the goal of achieving verification as a Level II Trauma Center by the American College of Surgeons.
- Parkview Trauma Centers is led by Raymond Cava, MD, FACS, Trauma Medical Director; Medical Director, Surgical Trauma ICU; Pediatric Trauma Medical Director and Pediatric ICU Co-medical Director, Parkview Regional Medical Center; Acute Care/Trauma Surgeon, PPG – Trauma & Acute Care Surgery and Lisa Hollister, DNP, MSN, RN, director, Trauma and Acute Care Surgery.
- As part of verification requirements, the centers have developed and continue to expand trauma prevention programs – Don't Drink and Drive, Don't Text & Drive, Teen Driver Safety, Share the Road, Helmet Safety, Know Falls and child maltreatment reduction - in collaboration with other organizations, such as Evan's Toyota, Allen County Department of Health and Indiana State Department of Health.
- In March 2012, with the opening of Parkview Regional Medical Center in northern Fort Wayne, Parkview Trauma Centers moved to this state-of-the-art facility.
- The Parkview Trauma Program has been leading the way in injury education, outreach and leadership. They championed the development of the Trauma Regional Advisory Council for District 3 in 2017, they serve in leadership roles in various regional, state, and national trauma committees, and Lisa Hollister serves on the Board of Directors for the Trauma Center Association of America.
